Cinquain



Cinquains have 5 lines and do not rhyme. They have a standard syllable pattern and were invented by Adelaide Crapsey, an American poet. *Cinq* is French for *five*. They have a total of 22 syllables (2, 4, 6, 8, 2). Read the following examples, then try one of your own:
