## **Hatching Times**

## **Various Poultry Breeds**

While chickens take 21 days to hatch, not all poultry are the same. Emus can take up to 8 weeks. It is important to know how long they take as all eggs must be turned regularly until just before hatching.

The carer (the male bird in some instances) turns the eggs many times a day. This is to move the embryo so that it gets fresh nutrients from the albumen (clear part of the egg) and prevent it from sticking to the side of the egg.

Just prior to hatching, the chick penetrates the air sac in the blunt end of the egg and begins breathing inside the shell. The shell is porous and good and bad gases are exchanged through the shell. Excessive movement at this stage could dislodge the chick's beak from the air sac and cause suffocation.

The carer instinctively knows when to stop turning the eggs prior to hatching. Clever?

The list below shows the hatching times for the more popular breeds of poultry and the time at which turning of the eggs should stop.
